**CONFIRM YOUR COURSE SELECTIONS WITH THE CONCORDIA UNIVERSITY
REGISTRAR OFFICE.**

Students anticipating transferring to Concordia University may use this guide for selecting Metropolitan Community College courses. Students should communicate frequently with the Concordia University Registrar Office to confirm course selections.

Within the hours required for graduation each student completes a program of 45 hours of general education. Students are required to meet the specific hours in each of these general education requirements. The minimum number of hours may be exceeded depending on the courses a student chooses.

To be admitted, transfer students must be in good standing and have a 2.00 or higher grade point average on a 4.00 scale at the institution from which they are transferring. A maximum of 70 semester hours will be accepted for transfer from a two-year institution.
