To generate an MLA citation, click the **double quotes icon** on the right and then select **MLA** from the menu.

This opens an MLA citation. You will need to make the following corrections:

• Follow MLA guidelines when capitalizing the title

- Omit the name of the database publisher (Statista)
- Precede the URL with MCC's proxy server coding: login.ezproxy.mccneb.edu/login?url=
- If the URL includes a terminal slash a forward slash at the end you can omit it if the URL works without it.
- If the URL takes up more than one line, do not insert spaces or hyphens to force a break. Use your computer's **Enter/Return** key instead.

NOTE: Because the URL works without the terminal slash, it was omitted from the citation.
