Omaha artist's work to be featured at MCC

OMAHA, Neb. — Metropolitan Community College will display the works of well-known Omaha artist Mary Zicafoose in a new exhibition, "Color Fields: selected works by Mary Zicafoose," March 6–April 7 at the Elkhorn Valley Campus Gallery of Art and Design, 204th and West Dodge Road. Gallery hours are Monday–Thursday, 9 a.m.–8 p.m.; Friday, 9 a.m.–5 p.m.; and Saturday, 10 a.m.–4 p.m. An opening reception will be held Wednesday, March 11, 5–6:30 p.m. in the gallery.

The exhibition will feature select ikats, tapestries, carpets and prints by Zicafoose. Additionally, Zicafoose will be part of an open discussion on March 11, 4–5 p.m., room 114 at the Elkhorn Valley Campus. Attendees will be able to ask Zicafoose about her work and discuss its meaning.
