New art exhibition to feature clay sculptures

OMAHA, Neb. —Art exhibition “Thrown & Built” will be featured beginning Oct. 21 in Metropolitan Community College’s Gallery of Art & Design at the Elkhorn Valley Campus, North 204th and West Dodge Road. The exhibition, which will run until Nov. 17, will showcase the work of 14 artists from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln’s Ceramics Department, and will contain traditional wheel-thrown dinnerware as well as hand built clay sculptures.

The talented artists will discuss their work at a public lecture in room 114 on Oct. 21, 4–5 p.m., followed by an opening reception in the gallery on Oct. 21, 5–6:30 p.m. at the Elkhorn Valley Campus. The art exhibition will feature artists who bring their individual perspectives to the gallery through the use of the clay medium.
