



## **Emergency Medical Technician - EMSP 1100 Course Information Sheet**

This Emergency Medical Technician course provides an introduction to Emergency Medical Care. Modules of training will include medical-legal, roles and responsibilities of the EMT, documentation and communication, human body anatomy and physiology of the major human systems, medical terminology, lifting and moving, airway management basic and advanced, patient assessment, medical and trauma, medical emergencies, treatment, and use of assisted medications and IV maintenance, bleeding control and shock, trauma emergencies, use of immobilization devices, obstetrical emergencies, childbirth, pediatrics and children emergencies, ambulance operations, hazardous materials, mass casualty, and triage. This course consists of 110 didactic hours, 55 hours of lab, and a minimum of five patient contacts.

- Offered all four quarters (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer)
- Offered days or evenings/weekend most quarters
- Offered at South Omaha Campus and Fremont Campus
- The course is 11 weeks long; student will be eligible to take the National Registry Exam upon successful completion of the course
- Cost of the course: Approximately \$1,601.00 (subject to change)
  - Tuition/Facility Fee: \$876.00 (\$68.00 tuition/credit hour + \$5.00 facility fee/credit hour) x 12 credits
  - Liability Insurance Fee: \$14.50
  - Background Check Fee: \$45.00
  - Ride-Along Scheduling Fee: \$31.50
  - Drug Screening: \$50.00
  - National Registry Exam Fee: \$104.00
  - Class supplies: details will be provided in class; Est. \$100.00
  - Textbook: varies, check with MCC bookstore; Est. \$220.00
  - Uniform: details will be provided in class; Est. \$160.00

### Registration Requirements:

- Submit completed EMT application packet:
  - Complete application form
  - Indicate desired quarter and section number
  - Signed Technical Standards form
  - Signed Checklist Requirement form
  - Complete and Signed Background Check form
- Proof of current CPR Certification (American Heart Association OR American Red Cross BLS (basic life support) are accepted)

- Math skills proficiency at 1000 level or higher through assessment testing (ACT last three years; ACCUPLACER/Companion and ALEKS last two years).

OR

Successful completion of MATH 0960 or MATH 0931

OR

Completion of any 1000 level Math class (excluding Applied Math for the Hospitality Industry, Statistics AND Business Math) with a grade C or higher (Algebra). (If coursework was completed at another institution, attach a copy of unofficial transcripts to the application form).

- English writing and reading skills at 1000-level courses through assessment testing or completion of comparable coursework. If coursework completed at another college, attach a copy of unofficial transcripts to the application form. Note: ACCUPLACER/Companion and English Writing Sample scores are good for two years only. ACT scores are good for three years.
- Copy of Driver's license or Birth Certificate
- Copies of immunizations on "checklist"
- Copy of High School Diploma, GED certificate, or College Degree

#### Registration Process

- Completed application and all required documentation must be submitted to the Health Careers office no later than 14 business days before the start of the quarter
- Students will be registered once application documents have been reviewed and approved
