

Transfer Guide - Radiography

$MCC \rightarrow UNMC$

The Radiography program is a bachelor's program at UNMC where students earn a Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging & Therapeutic Science. The program is a 21-month program and consists of lecture, demonstrations, laboratory and supervised clinical experiences. Students who have completed the admission requirements at MCC, have the opportunity to earn their associate's degree at MCC through the reverse transfer process. Listed below are Metropolitan Community College courses that satisfy the University of Nebraska Medical Center's (UNMC) Radiography admission requirements. Students should consult with their MCC Advisor and an UNMC advisor often.

Admission to the Radiography program requires the applicant to present a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) at time of application submission and successfully complete 26-semester hours (39-quarter hours) of prerequisites prior to matriculation.
