# General Education Transfer Guide

Upon completion of the Diagnostic Medical Sonography 21 month Associate program students are eligible to sit for the Association of Registered Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (ARDMS) registry. Graduates of the program have the option to further their education online at NMC by pursuing the Bachelor of Science in Women's Imaging or a Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration: Applied Clinical Operations.

Nebraska Methodist College offers two separate tracks for an Associate degree in sonography:

1. Multispecialty (General)
2. Cardiovascular Sonography

### Program Admission Criteria

Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 to be considered for admission. Applicants are evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Prerequisites of **College Algebra, College Physics, College English Composition, College Lifespan Psychology, College Anatomy and Physiology I and II and Medical Terminology**
- High school record
- ACT composite 20 or above or SAT 950 critical reading and mathematics score (if within 2 years of high school graduation)
- College record
- Fulfillment of program technical standards\*\*
- Shadowing experience strongly recommended and documentation may be submitted with application\*\*
