General Education Transfer Guide

Nebraska Methodist College offers a 22 month accelerated PTA program. Graduates of the Associate Physical Therapist Assistant degree program are eligible to sit for the national certification exam. MCC students may take several courses that are eligible for transfer into the PTA program at NMC but taking the courses below at Metro is not required and will not shorten the length of the program at NMC.

Program Admission Criteria

Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 to be considered for admission. Students with a GPA above to a 2.75 have a greater chance of gaining admission due to the competitive nature of the process.

Applicants are evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- High school record
- ACT composite of 20 or above or SAT of 950 critical reading and mathematics scores (if within 2 years of high school graduation)
- College Record (Any/All schools attended)
- Math and Science courses (Minimum 2 years high school math and science required)
- Recommended high school or college level physics
- 20-hour observation experience with documentation**
- Fulfillment of program technical standards**
