NOTES

- It is recommended that students complete the courses in the Associate in Science degree above within two years, and no more than five years. Courses transferred after five years are individually reviewed.
- The College of Nursing admits approximately 75 students into Omaha, 72 students into Lincoln, 48 into Kearney and Norfolk, and 36 students into Western Nebraska divisions in the fall of each year. Admission into the College of Nursing is competitive. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.67 is required. Admission preference is given to students with GPAs of 3.0 and above.
- Completed application deadline is February 1 for Traditional BSN fall admission.
- Since the number of students admitted is limited, completion of all the required courses does not guarantee admission into the College of Nursing.
