- To be considered for admission, students must complete 90 semester hours prior to matriculation, however most students will have earned their bachelors degree. These hours may be started at MCC and then completed at a four-year institution.
- The College of Dentistry is limited to 40 – 45 students per year.
- Admission into the College of Dentistry is very competitive. Important factors in an applicant's selection include:
  - Academic Background – GPA and science GPA
  - Dental Admissions Testing (DAT) scores
  - State of Residence – 75% of the students are from Nebraska
  - Community involvement and dental career or job shadowing
  - Interview
