

Liberal Arts Associate in Science Transfer Guide – Pre-Nursing (LASNO)

MCC → UNMC

By taking the suggested courses below, students are able to transfer into a baccalaureate degree program at UNMC upon completion of the associate degree. UNMC publishes requirements for admission, general education, and major concentration areas. **Students should consult with their MCC Advisor and an UNMC Nursing advisor often.**

*Note: By completing MCC's LASNO, students will complete 2 years of course work (approximately 63 semester hours) in the specific areas needed to go on to obtain their bachelor's degree. Students need to complete the majority of the prerequisite courses by the application deadline, and all courses must be completed before starting the BSN nursing curriculum at UNMC.

NOTES

- It is recommended that students complete the courses in the Associate in Science degree above within two years, and no more than five years. Courses transferred after five years are individually reviewed.
- The College of Nursing admits approximately 75 students into Omaha, 72 students into Lincoln, 48 into Kearney and Norfolk, and 36 students into Western Nebraska divisions in the fall of each year. Admission into the College of Nursing is competitive. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.67 is required. Admission preference is given to students with GPAs of 3.3 and above.
- Completed application deadline is February 1 for Traditional BSN fall admission.
- Since the number of students admitted is limited, completion of all the required courses does not guarantee admission into the College of Nursing.

Every effort has been made to provide accurate information on suggested courses, however it is the student's responsibility to consult with the institution they are planning to transfer to ensure courses fit into their intended plan of study.
