Explore Your Career This Summer **Metropolitan Community College**

If you are a college-ready high school student, age 16 and above, you can explore your career this summer. Metropolitan Community College (MCC) offers a variety of career focused college classes without prerequisites. Although qualified students can take any course where they meet the prerequisites, daytime courses in the trades, architecture, health sciences, criminal justice, and early childhood education (to name a few) are available this summer at almost all of the MCC campuses.

Eligibility: Students are required to be “college-ready” to be successful in 10-week, accelerated courses. Students must be 16 years and older to enroll (College-ready students younger than 16 years may enroll with special permission – contact the Secondary Partnership office for details), and should have proven proficiency in reading, math, and writing. If you are not sure if you are ready, consult your high school counselor. Some courses have prerequisites, and students must meet requirements to enroll in a course.

Summer Session: MCC’s Summer Session begins June 6, 2018 and finishes on August 15, 2018. Before enrolling, make sure your high school gives you permission to miss high school if the high school begins before August 15th next fall. Courses listed in this brochure follow that calendar unless otherwise noted. Teaching faculty typically have a very strict attendance policy, so make sure you can commit time over the 10-week period.

Career Courses: On the second page is a list of courses a student may want to consider. Most of these classes will give students a beginning view of a career. Introductory courses are meant to give students some content and skills that are necessary if you were to get a job in that career. Students need to consult their counselor as these courses may not count toward high school credit.

Cost: High school students including graduates in the Class of 2018 are eligible for half price tuition. For this summer (2018), tuition and fees are only \$35.50 per credit hour. Students also purchase their own textbooks and materials, including any required special software. Material costs for each class vary. Textbooks are available at MCC campuses around May 20th.

How Do I Enroll?: High school students who are interested in taking any course at MCC this summer will contact an MCC advisor to make an appointment and choose a course(s), and complete a CollegeNow! form. Call 531-622-2400 and ask for an advisor at the campus closest to you. Completing a CollegeNow! form and attaching payment for tuition and fees helps assure the student is registered at the half tuition rate.
