

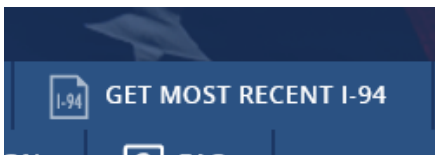


How to Print your I-94 Admission Record

You will need your printed I-94 record in order to check in at the ISS Office and to request immigration benefits. It is strongly recommend that all nonimmigrants access and print a copy of their electronic I-94 record each time after entering the U.S.

Step 1: Go to the Department of Homeland (DHS) website: <https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/#/home>


Step 2: Click on Get Most Recent I-94:



Step 3: Read the Security Notification and Give Consent:
